The worth of a dancer's career is often measured by the time spent in the limelight. Yet a dancer's experience of their career extends beyond the stage. This series of short films reveals an archive of untold stories and unspoken values by women in dance in Ireland. Collaborating with filmmaker Pato Cassinoni, animator Alan Early and composer Irene Buckley, Laura Murphy presents an innovative and multifaceted exploration of eight women in dance in Ireland: Jean Butler,



Alicia Christofi-Walshe, Lisa Cliffe, Finola Cronin, Joan Davis, Katherine O'Malley, Mary Nunan and Angie Smalis.

Tangle features two aerial artists entangled in anxieties of ropes, an extension of the mind into a physical world in which they navigate. Experimenting with vertical rope structures, the artists climb, spiral, bend, unravel, challenging traditional movement possibilities. This work in progress piece explores layers of identity, attempting to unravel a tangled identity.
